The Stories of Change project has explored the past, present and future of energy through the powerful stories of individuals, groups and communities to create inspiring case studies that help raise awareness and understanding of our relationship with energy.

With funding from the Arts and Humanities Research Council, the project has collaborated with organisations including the National Trust, Fit For the Future Network and Community Energy England to show how transforming our energy systems, in response to climate change, can have a positive impact on people's lives.

Using written, audio and photographic material, Stories of Change has documented how a wind turbine has benefited the Hebridean island of Tiree and ways in which Gloucester Cathedral has embraced cutting edge technology. By reducing carbon emissions the RNLI now has more funds available for front line services and a London family's energy choices have transformed their home. A groundbreaking energy project in Snowdonia is cutting household bills and strengthening the sense of community whilst energy cooperatives across the country are reaping the rewards of renewable generation. The stories have engaged both the public and politicians through this imaginative approach to current and future energy choices.
